(Baton Rouge) – On October 28, 2011, the Baton Rouge Little Theater, or BRLT, will open their second show in the 2011-2012 Season of Love and Laughter, Tennessee Williams’ “A Streetcar Named Desire.”

Under the direction of Keith Dixon, this sultry, seductive, and quintessential southern tragedy reveals to the very depths the character of Blanche du Bois; A woman whose life has been undermined by her romantic illusions, which lead her to reject – so far as possible – the realities of life with which she is faced and which she consistently ignores.

The pressures brought to bear upon her by her sister, with whom she goes to live in New Orleans, intensified by the earthy and extremely "normal" young husband of the latter, lead to a revelation of her tragic self-delusion and, in the end, to madness.

The Seattle Times says it’s full of "Keen intelligence, poetic fervor and unflinching compassion." This production is rated PG-13.
